PARENT MEETING KINDERGARTEN AND/ OR NEW TO PRE PRIMARY 2026

The general information session for parents only who have children commencing Kindergarten and/or new to Pre Primary in 2026 will be held on Wednesday 19 November commencing at 9:00 am in the school library. For parents new to the school please come to the front office for directions to the library.

KINDERGARTEN AND PRE PRIMARY ARRANGEMENTS 2026

At this point there will be one Kindergarten class, one Kindergarten /Pre Primary class and one Pre Primary class for 2026. Staff appointments to classes are not known. The decision about the class arrangements will be made available as soon as possible and is dependent upon student numbers. At this point, new Kindergarten parents have been informed of the days their child will attend Kindergarten in 2026 and the opportunity to select their class preference. Due to one Kindergarten/ Pre Primary class and one Pre Primary class for 2026, parents of current Kindergarten children are invited to submit written input with respect to class placement.

For parent information, when making decisions about children's placement in classes the staff considers a range of educational criteria (where applicable) including:

- Individual development levels (academic, social, and emotional)
- · Peer groups
- Gender balances (where possible)
- · Special needs e.g. family situation
- School psychologist recommendations
- Written parent submissions regarding a child's educational needs.

Parents responses are due in by Friday 21 November 2025.

Parents of children in Years 1 – 6 in 2026 will have the opportunity through a newsletter later in Term 4 to submit their written input in relation to class placement. Please note hat all written submissions from parents will be considered but not automatically accommodated.

YEAR 1 2026

To assist parents in supporting their children with the transition from Pre Primary to Year 1, parents of current Pre Primary children that have their first child in the family moving into primary school in 2026 are invited to attend a general information session on Friday 5 December commencing at 2:30 pm in the school library. Class teacher/ parent meetings from Kindergarten to Year 6 will be held early in Term 1 2026.

Dental health - Keep your child's teeth healthy

Teeth are important possessions. Here are some tips for keeping them healthy.

- Clean teeth, gums and tongue at least twice a day with a soft toothbrush. Parents should supervise tooth brushing until children are 8 or 9 years old as children do not have the dexterity to brush the molars properly until then.
- Adults and children should use a pea-sized amount of fluoride toothpaste. Toothpaste should be spat out after brushing and never eaten or swallowed. Do not rinse your mouth out with water after brushing your teeth.
- Rinse your toothbrush thoroughly after brushing and store it hygienically. Replace your toothbrush regularly.
- Older children and adults should floss their teeth daily.
- Eating and drinking healthily is important for keeping your teeth healthy try to keep away from too much sugar, especially between meals.
