Dear Parents, Students and Community Members

The past fortnight has been very busy with events including – the building programs underway, the music assembly, the parent/ volunteer thank you morning tea, the Kings Park excursion for the Year 1/2, Year 2 Aqua and Orange children, golf in PE time, many Year 6 children attending their various high school orientation day, the continuation of dance lessons, and Thinkers Club.



BUILDING UPDATE

Two different building projects are currently underway at Lake Monger Primary School the revamping the Children's Garden and the Mount Hawthorn Education Support Centre moving onto the Lake Monger Primary School grounds.

To date temporary fencing has been placed around the school as work is undertaken in these areas.

The Nature/ Adventure playground has been closed but will be relocated to the east end of the school grounds over the break. The dome is also closed during the summer break and will be relocated to the 'playground hub' near the back of our current Early Childhood Area in the new year.

The multi purpose court outside the under cover area is due to be closed for resurfacing on the 15 December and a new multi purpose court will be built over the break next to the under cover area, on the eastern side. Line markings for the new court should be completed by the end of Term 1 2026.

As you are aware, there are 3 entrances only to the school grounds; one from Powis and 2 from Dodd Street. The children are to be congratulated on the way they have adapted their play to the reduced play ground areas.

Anxiety – how to help your child

All children experience anxious feelings as part of their normal childhood development. Some anxious feelings include fear, agitation, nervousness, worry and apprehension. Some children find it harder to get these feelings under control and may experience anxiety more intensely and more often than others.

Anxiety is when the level of fear or worry about something is out of proportion to the level of risk or danger. Thinking about the situation makes them more worried and tense.

If your child is experiencing anxiety try to:

Acknowledge your child's fear – don't dismiss or ignore it.

Gently encourage them to do things they're anxious about, but don't push them to face situations they're not yet ready to face.

Wait until they actually get anxious before you step in to help

Praise him for doing something they're anxious about, rather than criticising them for being afraid.

Avoid labelling your child as 'shy' or 'anxious'.

Your child might need some extra support if their anxiety stops them from doing the things they want to do or interferes with their friendships, school work or family life.


