Dear Parents, Students and Community Members

Welcome to the first newsletter of the 2026 school year!

It was so lovely to see the children and their families back at school on Monday 2 February. There was great excitement before school as the children reacquainted with their friends, and parents had the opportunity to catch up, before the children entered their classrooms and commenced the 2026 school year. At this point we have 342 children enrolled from Kindergarten – Year 6, 15 classes in total.

We have had a very smooth start to the school year. A special welcome to our new families and we hope you enjoy your stay at Lake Monger Primary School. We really appreciate parent's efforts with ensuring the children have their stationery, book and uniform requirements. Thank you for ensuring all items have the child's name clearly labelled including stationery, lunch boxes, water bottles and all school uniform items. Please be reminded that caps are not a part of the school uniform. For health and safety reasons children's hair longer than shoulder length needs to be tied up. Please ensure children wear a helmet when riding their bike to and from school. Also please remind your children to lock their bike or scooter on arrival to school. Thank you to parents and children for walking bikes/ scooters through the school grounds for safety reasons.

The children look great in their school uniforms. Our uniform coordinator has done a terrific job. Many thanks to Mrs Claire Stevens for all her work with the uniform organisation and sales.

In regard to the building program, the following work occurred over the break –

- The Year 1 White classroom (2025) was demolished
- The dome play equipment was relocated to the playground hub and was ready for the children on day 1.
- The rejuvenated Children's Garden was ready for the children on day 1
- The relocated Nature/ Adventure playground was ready for the children on day 1
- The oval and cricket nets were available for the children on day 1
- One basketball court was ready for the children on day 1. The resurfacing of this court and the line marking will occur in the April school holidays.
- The new basket ball court next to the undercover area is expected to be ready for the 20 February. The line markings on this court will also occur in the April school holidays.

Updates about the building program will continue to be communicated to parents through the newsletter. If you have any queries about the building program, please contact Ms Tomlinson.

### **PARENT / CLASS TEACHER MEETINGS**

Parent/ Class Teacher meetings will be held within the first four weeks of Term 1. The purpose of the meeting is to meet your child's teacher/s, hear about procedures, room organisation and the learning program. Parents have the opportunity to ask questions and arrange a parent/ teacher interview if required. Your child's teacher will inform you of the time and date of the meeting. If you are interested in being a parent classroom representative, please let your child's teacher know. ### **E RIDEABLES**

#### **eRideables ban for students under 16**

The safety of students is our priority and under WA laws, only individuals aged 16 and over are permitted to use eRideables or eBikes with the motor engaged.

From 2 February 2026 (first day of Term 1), the Department of Education introduced a ban on the use and storage of eRideables and eBikes on public schools grounds by students under the age of 16. This ban supports student safety and aligns with road safety laws.

Please be aware that not all eRideables or eBikes sold in WA are legal to ride on WA roads and paths. Visit the Road Safety Commission for more information on eRideable and eBike laws, penalties, buying guides and safety.

Thank you for your support in keeping our students and school community safe.

### **SPEECH PATHOLOGIST AT LAKE MONGER PRIMARY SCHOOL 2026**

Lake Monger Primary School is committed to providing support to students in our school. In 2026 we have employed a speech pathologist for 2 days per fortnight through the Speech Pathologist in School Program. Ms Kerri Altshuler will assist with speech, language and literacy skills of children in our school, as well as assisting parents with accessing external support for their children. We welcome Ms Altshuler to our school.

### **PARKING**

Parents are reminded of the parking arrangements on Dodd Street by the Town of Cambridge. A two-minute Kiss and Drive zone is available. This zone is for dropping off and picking up children who are waiting nearby. This is not a parking area.

Lake Monger Primary School is very fortunate to have such ample parent parking. For safety reasons parents are asked to refrain from parking in the staff carpark.

### **NEWSLETTER**

### **BREAKFAST CLUB, SCHOOL CANTEEN and EXTERNAL CANTEEN**

Breakfast Club (8:10 am – 8:30 am) will commence for 2026 on Wednesday 11 February. Thank you very much to Mrs Pamela van der Meulen and the volunteers for all their work with organising the breakfast club in our school.

The School Canteen commenced operating on Friday 6 February. Orders are placed using Flexischools.

The external canteen is available every Wednesday. Information about ordering is on the P&C tab on the school website.

Thank you to our P&C for making the arrangements for the external canteen and to Ms Caitlin Clarke for organising the distribution of the lunches to the children every Wednesday..

### **PRIORITIES**

The school priority areas for 2026 are Reading Comprehension/ Reading for Meaning and Writing. Mathematics and Well-being for students and staff, and Behaviour - students are on High Maintenance.

### **CRICKET PITCH UPGRADE**

The upgrade to the cricket pitch will commence on the 20 March. The funding for the upgrade was provided through a Community Use of School Sporting Facilities partnership grant between Lake Monger Primary School and Wembley Cricket Club. The upgrade will see certain grades of boys and girls cricket played on the school oval during the 2026/27 cricket season.

### **SMART PHONE/ SMART WATCH POLICY**

In line with the Department of Education policy children who bring a mobile phone or smart watch to school must bring the device to the office on arrival at school for safe keeping during the school day.

If children need to contact parents during the school day this occurs through the front office.

## SUNSMART

Lake Monger Primary School is a SunSmart school and therefore children need to wear a bucket, wide brimmed hat or legionaries hat when outside. Children without a hat will need to play in the undercover area or the veranda area during recess and lunch time. This also includes children that wear a cap. Hats are worn all year round.

## NAPLAN (NATIONAL ASSESSMENT PROGRAM IN LITERACY AND NUMERACY)

NAPLAN testing for children in Years 3 and 5 will be held in Term 1 2025, the 11 March – 23 March. The NAPLAN brochure has been distributed to all children in Years 3 and 5 students to bring home to parents.

## 2026 THIRD PARTY SERVICES AGREEMENT AND CONSENT FORMS, and PARENT AND CHILD VOLUNTEER DECLARATION FORM FOR FAMILIES NEW TO LAKE MONGER PRIMARY SCHOOL

Families new to the school will receive a link to complete the online consent forms. This form gives consent for your child to access the internet to use websites and iPad Applications at school, as well as Media and Viewing Consent to publish student images and work, and view videos. Every student must have consent to be able to access computers or iPads at school.

The Parent and Child Volunteer Declaration form is completed by parents if they are working with children eg: in the classroom, assisting on an excursion etc.

## PEANUT / NUT ALLERGY

We have students in the school with allergies to peanuts and/ or nuts. The allergy can cause the children to have an anaphylactic reaction. To minimise the risk we ask that parents/ carers do not include peanut paste, nuts etc in their child's morning tea and lunch. This would be very much appreciated; however we understand this is not always possible. Thank you to parents involved for checking the expiry date on their children's medication that is used at school. (eg: epipens, asthma puffers etc.)

## VOLUNTARY CONTRIBUTIONS

Thank you very much to parents who have paid their voluntary contributions already. We have had many parents to date pay the voluntary contribution of \$60 per child and this is greatly appreciated. These funds support learning areas in the school as outlined in the Voluntary Contributions and Charges letter sent home to parents at the end of November last year.

In 2025 the total of contributions collected from Kindergarten to Year 6 was 79%.

## ASSEMBLY

The first assembly (hosting) of the year will be held on Friday 13 February commencing at 8:40am and conducted by the Year 6 class.

## LEAVE PASSES

All parents from Kindergarten – Year 6 need to come to the office firstly to receive a leave pass if you are taking your child out of school during the course of the school day. Parents are asked to show the leave pass to your child's classroom teacher.

## EARLY ARRIVERS

Children are asked to be at school no earlier than 8:20am (unless attending a special program e.g. band) as advertised in the Parent Information booklet. Children who arrive prior to this time need to wait outside the main classroom block. Children are not permitted on any of the play equipment before or after school for safety reasons.

## ABSENCES

In past years, the main reason for children being absent from our school is either because children are returning to school late after school holidays or leaving prior to school holidays commencing. This practice is disruptive for the children because every day away from school is a day of important learning missed. Also, when many children are away at the same time whole school events are difficult to plan e.g. faction and interschool carnivals.

The SMS attendance line is no longer available due to the school moving to Compass, the latest Department of Education endorsed program for recording student attendance. 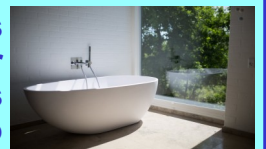


### **Sunsmart Message**

# Mathematics and Physical Sciences After School Program Since 2001

FOR STUDENTS AGE 10 AND UP

## Physics Primer

**L** Mondays 4:30 – 6:30pm

Students perform calculations to solve problems of motion, including gravity and then other forces in the universe. Students may also train for the Australian Science Olympiads Examination for Physics and/or the Open Universities Australia units *General Physics* and/or *Principles of Physics*.

## Chemistry Primer

**L** Thursdays 4:30 – 6:30pm

Students perform calculations to learn about atoms, molecules, elements and compounds and progress to calculations in topics such as gases, specific heat and chemical solutions. Students may also train for the Australian Science Olympiads Examination for Chemistry and/or the Open Universities Australia unit *Fundamentals of Chemistry*.

## Mathematics Primer

**L** Fridays 4:30 – 6:30pm

**\$** \$225per student each term

Students consolidate their Arithmetic and are introduced to Algebra, Geometry and Trigonometry, followed by Calculus and other areas when required. Mathematical topics are taught at each student's pace, and students learn mathematical conventions and techniques.

The Murdoch University *After School Program in Mathematics and Physical Sciences* has been running since 2001.

All sessions are at Murdoch University, South Street Campus, Building 450, Floor 3, Room 001. Parking available in carpark 4.

Sessions are tailored to each individual student and students may begin at any time during the term. Refund will only be given if course is cancelled by our Program.

Sessions commence the second week of each school term and do not run on public holidays. All subjects require pen or pencil and notebook, and may require a scientific calculator. Bottled water is permitted in classrooms and students should bring a healthy snack.
