When you arrive at school in the morning, walk on down to the undercover area where Mr Douglass will be there to acknowledge your participation in this event with a piece of fruit and a sticker. UNIFORM

All the children have been great with the wearing of their hats. Hats are worn all year round. Thank you also to parents for ensuring children are wearing their correct school uniform including the green school jacket. Just a reminder that denim and leggings worn under skirts and dresses are not a part of the school uniform.

PEANUT / NUT ALLERGY

We have students in the school with allergies to peanuts and/ or nuts. The allergy can cause the children to have an anaphylactic reaction. To minimise the risk we ask that parents/ carers do not include peanut paste, nuts etc in their child's morning tea and lunch. This would be very much appreciated; however we understand this is not always possible. Thank you to parents involved for checking the expiry date on their children's medication that is used at school. (eg: epipens, asthma puffers etc.) **Parents are asked that no nuts are contained in birthday cupcakes etc. for the class.**

Dental health - Keep your child's teeth healthy

Teeth are important possessions. Here are some tips for keeping them healthy.

Clean teeth, gums and tongue at least twice a day with a soft toothbrush. Parents should supervise tooth brushing until children are 8 or 9 years old as children do not have the dexterity to brush the molars properly until then.

Adults and children should use a pea-sized amount of fluoride toothpaste. Toothpaste should be spat out after brushing and never eaten or swallowed. Do not rinse your mouth out with water after brushing your teeth.

Rinse your toothbrush thoroughly after brushing and store it hygienically. Replace your toothbrush regularly.

Older children and adults should floss their teeth daily.

Eating and drinking healthily is important for keeping your teeth healthy – try to keep away from too much sugar, especially between meals.

RECYCLING

The Town of Cambridge provided our school with a recycling station. The station is located in the front office for parents and children to use. Items for recycling include batteries, mobile phones, fluorescent globes, printer cartridges, bottle caps, household lights and toothpaste.

BIKE RIDING

We are really pleased with the increasing number of children riding their bikes to and from school because of the health benefits associated with exercise; however it is compulsory for all children and adults to wear a helmet when riding a bike.
